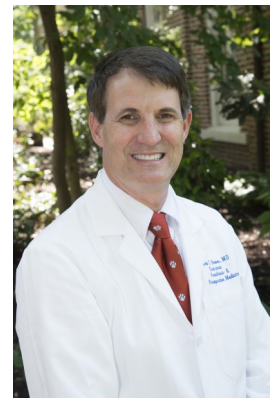

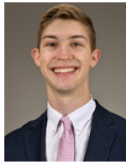
Riley Graham, M.D.

**Alex Berghorst, D.O.**

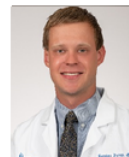

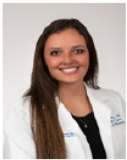
Zach Lee, M.D.

SOAP IN THE BIG EASY BY KATIE HATTER, MD

SOAP 2023 was held in New Orleans, LA from May 3rd to May 7th this year, and this year's meeting theme was "Building Stronger Care Systems and Teams: Pursuing Personalized Maternal Care". Our department was represented by Mike Marotta, Jessi Stockinger, Julie Chedister, Brad Miller, and myself. David Gutman, although did not attend in person, was an integral author on all the presentations. Our residents did a phenomenal job representing MUSC with multiple case report presentations which are listed below. They presented with poise and handled the question and answer components of the presentations with grace and quick thinking.

The keynote speaker, Amy Edmondson, kicked off the meeting with an invigorating and intriguing presentation about leadership, highlighting that psychological safety and high standards should not be at odds. She stressed the concept of inclusiveness and that anyone's voice can make a difference. The annual esteemed Ostheimer Lecture was given by Dr. Pervez Sultan from Stanford University, providing a comprehensive review of the most up-to-date literature in OB anesthesia over the preceding year. A few of the reviewed studies included evaluating the difference between buprenorphine and methadone in opioid use disorders in pregnancy (buprenorphine was found to have lower risk for adverse neonatal outcomes!), testing for reported penicillin allergies, role of TIVA in cesarean delivery, and many other papers/studies. We attended many poster sessions, and several presentations around the workflow on the L&D provided insight into how other centers have tackled work delays and communication errors. Dr. David Preiss with Brigham and Women's created a workflow app that is similar to what you would see at a Starbucks with non-urgent tasks inputted by the RNs that would change colors as time elapsed. This app on tablets around L&D allowed Brigham to assess how many nonurgent requests the RNs would send to the anesthesia team to complete. Interesting use of technology to improve communication and task completion!

As with every meeting, we walked away with exciting ideas we hope to implement in our own practice as we continue to strive to become a SOAP Center of Excellence. We were recruited to participate in the General Anesthesia Registry for Cesarean Delivery that SOAP is sponsoring and Yale University is spearheading, and we hope to be IRB approved soon to begin collecting data. We have secured one of our grand rounds speakers for September, Dr. Andrea Girnius with the University of Cincinnati. She is dual fellowship trained in cardiac and obstetric anesthesiology and has an interest in communication, teaming, and organizational psychology. We cannot wait to host her and hear her presentation!

Besides the incredible lectures and poster sessions, we had fun catching up with previous colleagues, networking, and enjoying the NOLA cuisine, culture, and music. We're looking forward to attending SOAP 2024 in Denver, CO next May!




